At our October meeting, we had a talk on the Everyman Theatre by Caro Day. The New Theatre and Opera House, later the Everyman, opened on 1 October 1891, as a result of the growing prosperity of Cheltenham and the spa waters. It is one of the last surviving of the



200 venues designed by Frank Matcham, which included the London Palladium. It was saved from closure in 1959 and re-opened as The Everyman. Steven Berkoff, Harold Pinter and Penelope Keith amongst other well-known names today started their careers there.

Caro also gave us a fascinating glimpse of what goes on backstage of the theatre to create the illusion we see as the audience. We were invited to take part in a 'play' complete with costumes. 5 members bravely volunteered and created a lot of entertainment involving rescuing a Lady in distress, vagabonds and a sword fight! A very entertaining and informative evening much enjoyed by all our members, and appropriately we had the talk on its 133rd anniversary!

Our November meeting was our AGM and looking ahead, our December meeting will be a talk on "Spooky Magic" Magician and Storyteller by Nick Brunger and January is our afternoon tea meeting, with Pam Holland talking about Tales from a Travel Rep.

Unauthorised Caravan Site – Kayte Lane

A Public Inquiry will be held at Tewkesbury Borough Council offices on 14th January 2025 at 10am. If you submitted an objection, you should receive an invitation to attend.

The Appellant has appealed on ground a) & g) as set out in Section 174(2) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990. Those grounds are: b) that, in respect of the breach of planning control which may be constituted by the matters stated in the notice, planning permission ought to be granted. g) that any period specified in the notice in accordance with Section 173(9) falls short of what should be reasonably be allowed.

Cycleway Project

The Parish Council has been consulted on the latest proposal to provide crossing points on the A435. A copy of the relevant plans and statement of reasons may be viewed at The Map Room, Shire Hall, Westgate Street, Gloucester, GL1 2TG, Bishops Cleeve Library, Tobyfield Road Bishops Cleeve, Cheltenham, GL52 8NN and Cheltenham Borough Council, Municipal Offices, Promenade, Cheltenham, GL50 9SA during their normal opening hours or online at www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/tros.

New Motorway Junction 9a

Gloucestershire County Council is currently running a public engagement exercise until Monday, 2 December 2024 on potential route options for the M5 Junction 9 and A46 (Ashchurch) Transport Scheme.

The scheme proposes the development of a new M5 Junction 9a near Tewkesbury and the rerouting of the existing A46 around Ashchurch to Teddington Hands roundabout. The scheme will inevitably cut through fields and changes may be made to the Seven Bends junction. Hard copies and accessible formats of the public engagement documentation can be requested by emailing M5Junction9@atkinsrealis.com or by calling 01454 667490 and leaving a message.

Once this is in place the PC plan to organise a Parish walk about to investigate where the village appearance and safety could be improved. The PC would also like to thank the WI for tea, coffee and cakes after the Remembrance Service, together with the parishioners that marshalled the road closures, to enable the event to take place.


Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)

The Council is in receipt of CIL funding £19770 which can be used for infrastructure improvements or maintenance. It is proposed that some of this money will fund verge maintenance in the current year but the Parish Council is seeking proposals for the balance of the fund. Items which may be funded as follows: Street Furniture (seats etc); Play Equipment; Land Purchase; Traffic Calming; Kissing Gates to replace stiles; Maintenance of public infrastructure owned by the Council

It was agreed to investigate an audio system for the Village Hall to be used at PC and other meetings. Allotments, children's play equipment were also raised. If you have any suggestions, please contact the clerk or councillors.
